I think now is a good time to readdress the issue of tourism in the Ojai Valley.

I know it's easy and sort of fun to bash the tourists that come here, the stupid hipster hats they wear, and the traffic that's produced.

But tourism is a major part of the local economy and has been for many years. Local families rely on tourism to put food on the table and make ends meet.

Last June, a small but vocal group convinced the city council to stop promoting the city. This resulted in the Ojai Visitors Bureau shutting down on October 31.

Now the Ojai Valley Inn is shut down until mid January. The Oaks will be closed for two months. One third of our city's revenue comes directly from the local hotel industry.

I am a local business owner and I should have been at that meeting in June. I'm told not a single business owner spoke up, and we instead let our city's finances become governed by a tiny, self interested group.

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decisions were, and come together to find solutions that are genuinely in the communal best interest.

"Ojai First" should mean just that. Suppressing local businesses, just to appease a few people who are already set up, is not putting 'Ojai First'. Putting Ojai first means supporting the local economy. Making sure bills get paid, and that people have a roof over their head.

I am saddened to hear about a local council member showing up at the Rancho yesterday and insisting there weren't permits in place. In fact there were permits. As well as local young people selling their wares, to support their children.

When our representatives are so uninformed, and yet so committed to a short sighted agenda, it's time to take a step back and reassess things.

I would like to encourage all business owners and local employees to join together and push back. Ojai is so much more than a few angry anti-tourist zealots. We are a community, which largely relies on tourism to keep the ball rolling, keep doors open, and keep this Ojai train chuggin' along.

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



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
